

NATCON 2018 Overview



NATCON '18 in Charlotte/Concord, NC was a resounding success. In all 40 Pershing Rifles units were represented at NATCON, of that 21 of them participated in the General John J. Pershing Memorial Drill Competition held at the Charlotte Motor Speedway which was a few miles away from the official NATCON hotel, The Great Wolf Lodge Charlotte/Concord.

The weekend festivities began with the Alumni Dinner at the White Pine Room of the Great Wolf Lodge on Thursday evening.

On Friday 10 March, the Drill Competition commenced with an Inspection of the Troops. The reviewing officer was David W. Shuey an actor portraying General Pershing. Thereafter the drill competition was held at Charlotte Motor Speedway here Troop L-1 from the University of Toledo emerged as the "Varsity Rifles" Pershing Rifles National Drill Champions for the Sixth consecutive year.

On Saturday morning which began early, the Pershing Rifles Group Joint Meeting which was well attended. Later the Society's legislative meeting which was held behind closed doors as is the tradition and ended with a vote to elect P/R MG Maximillian Curtis as National Commander. Later Pershing Riflemen toured Charlotte and visited local sites of interest.

The evening ended with a reception and the annual military style formal dinner and awards ceremony at the Great Wolf Lodge, COL Farrell J. 

Congratulations to our newest Pershing Rifles units, Company B-4 University of South Carolina, Columbia, SC (shown above) and Company E-16 Bethune-Cookman University, Daytona Beach, FL, which were presented their charters at the NATCON '18 Formal Dinner on 10 March 2018.

Company B-4 University of South Carolina was originally chartered as Company K-4 in 1962, and was the only Naval ROTC Company in 4th Regiment and the only company in the Society to use the Marine Eight-man Squad Drill. It placed 2nd in the Forth Regimental Drill Meet in 1965. Members of the company proudly served as the University's permanent honor guard and performed during numerous events including football games. USC's tenure in the Society was short lived as it was replaced by South Carolina State College as Company K-4 in 1966.

Although Company E-16 Bethune-Cookman University is a newly chartered unit it has observed Pershing Rifles traditions since at least 2015.

Former National Commander Donte' M. Hanns Receives the Pershing Rifles Life Saving Award

Former Pershing Rifles National Commander (2014-15) and current Ohio State Highway Patrol Trooper Donte' M. Hanns was presented with the Pershing Rifles Life Saving Award during the P/R National Convention formal dinner on the evening 10 March 2018, for his lifesaving actions in November 2017.

Hanns was on a routine patrol along U.S. 20 in Ohio on 9 November 2017, when he noticed traffic begin to slow around 9 AM. He later observed a car emitting smoke that had been involved in a crash near Fremont, Ohio. "It's a lot to take in. It's the first biggest thing I've handled in my career, but it's another teaching tool for me and maybe others who have seen it," Hanns said.

While he attempted to free the driver, the car caught fire. Trooper Hanns broke the window and was able to remove the driver before the car became engulfed in flames Because Hanns was patrolling the area, he was able to get the driver out of the car before it burst into flames. If the victim had to wait for a trooper to arrive after being dispatched to the crash site, it would have been too late. "By the time the next trooper had arrived on the scene, the car was fully engulfed in flames and he would have been stuck inside there," Hanns said in November, "If I wasn't close by I'd say he would have been engulfed in there."

The Pershing Rifles Life Saving Award was designed by the U.S. Army Institute of Heraldry and approved by Pershing Rifles National Headquarters in 1964.

The last know presentation of this award was in 1988, when former Pershing Rifleman Alumni Don Brookshire of Company C-4 Clemson University received the medal for rescuing individuals from an apartment fire while serving with the Clemson Police Department.

Donte M. Hanns

On November 14, 2017, former Pershing Rifles National Commander, P/R Major General (Retired) Donte M. Hanns distinguished himself through extraordinary acts of heroism while serving as an Ohio State Highway Patrol officer. Rifleman Hanns responded to a vehicle collision on U.S. highway 20, near County Road 198 in Fremont, Ohio, where a driver ran a stop sign and collided with another vehicle. Upon approaching the vehicle, Rifleman Hanns realized the driver's legs were trapped, and he called for EMS support. Shortly after, the car caught fire, and Rifleman Hanns reacted instantly, and used his baton to break the car's passenger window and pulled the man from his car. Seconds later, the vehicle was completely engulfed in flames. Rifleman Hanns' heroism and selflessness above and beyond the call of duty, and at the risk of his own life, are in keeping with the highest traditions of military service and the National Society of Pershing Rifles.

Anti-Hazing Policy

The National Society of Pershing Rifles will not tolerate ANY hazing, especially in the initiation procedures for any Pershing Rifles pledges at any chartered Pershing Rifles unit. This applies to both mental and physical hazing.

Hazing is defined as any conduct whereby one Pershing Rifleman, regardless of rank, causes another member or pledge to suffer or be exposed to an activity that is cruel, abusive, humiliating, or oppressive. Hazing includes, but is not limited to, any form of initiation or congratulatory act that involves physically striking another to inflict pain, piercing another's skin in any manner, encouraging another to excessively consume alcohol, or encouraging another to engage in illegal, harmful, demeaning or dangerous acts. In addition to physical contact, hazing can also be verbal or psychological in nature.

If at any time a Pershing Rifleman or pledge, regardless of rank, finds a violation to this directive, he or she is to report the violation to the National Commander. A Pershing Rifleman active or alumni who have been found guilty of hazing will be stripped of all rank and rights of a Pershing Rifleman, and will be subject to permanent expulsion from the Society and considered for legal action.

My goals for this year is to continue our success from this past year, continue re-expansion efforts across the nation, and to ensure stronger lines of communication between the National Headquarters staff and companies. We are here to serve you, but if problems are not brought to our attention it becomes difficult to fix them, so I implore everyone reading this to please let us know how we can continue to strive to make our society better. My staff is on notice at any time to answer your questions and help facilitate solutions to problems.

I would like to write about a recent experience of mine that has shed quite a bit of light on how I view this society and the potential it holds. My home company, G-7 took a two and half hour trip north to visit one of our fellow companies, Company A-2 "Pershing's Own". The brotherhood and camaraderie that was constantly present was amazing to see. Friendships formed at NATCON that were continuing to be built afterwards. Along with this, both companies learned from each other on how they run their own company, whether it is candidate cycles, drill practices, or brotherhood events, there was always at least a little something that was different.


PERSHING RIFLES ALUMNI WHO HAVE PASSED
